What is L2 Award in Risk Assessment?

Every business is required to conduct suitable and sufficient risk assessments. This is suitable for learners working in environments who need to be more risk-aware. It improves their knowledge of risk in the workplace and the basic steps they can take to control it.

The Level 2 Award in Risk Assessment is designed to help enable learners understand the basic principles of risk assessment. A risk assessment is not about creating huge amounts of paperwork, but rather about identifying sensible measures to control the risks in the workplace.

The Law

The Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974 requires you to provide whatever information, instruction, training and supervision as is necessary to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the health and safety at work of your employees.

This is expanded by the Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999, which identify situations where health and safety training is particularly important, eg when people start work, on exposure to new or increased risks and where existing skills may have become rusty or need updating.
